Turkish Biochemical Society: Celebrating 41st Years with the Doctrine of Continuous Support for Young Scientists in Basic and Applied Biochemistry

Turkish Biochemical Society (TBS) was founded in 1975 at Ankara, with the leadership of Professor Şerafettin Özkurt, to serve as an umbrella for establishing and supporting professional contacts and information exchange among all those working in the field of basic and applied biochemistry (clinical chemistry, molecular biology, biotechnology, molecular medicine, bioinformatics, etc.) mainly through organization of scientific activities. Besides stimulating scientific collaborations within professionals of the field, TBS aims to advance research in the science of biochemistry and to improve undergraduate and postgraduate biochemistry education. Another mission of TBS is to enhance patient care through trainings on competence, quality and accreditation of medical laboratories in Turkey for improvement of their standards and service. Through active collaborations with concerned governmental (Ministry of Health, etc.) and nongovernmental institutions (educational and research bodies), the society also delivers assistance on related health issues and is involved in developing health policies.

Today, TBS is one of the leading national associations of Turkey with more than two thousands (2.000) members and official branches at major cities like Istanbul, Izmir and Adana. The Society represents graduate students and professionals working in the area of basic and applied biochemistry (clinical chemistry, molecular biology, biotechnology, molecular medicine, bioinformatics, etc.) and also accepts non-residential scientists living in other countries as members as long as they are Turkish citizens.

 National congresses - Between 1978 – 2000, TBS organized a National Congress every 18 months while after 2000, annual nationwide congresses were organised in various cities of Turkey. organized in Antalya with more than 600 participants (Fig. 1 and Fig. 2).

- Hosting international conferences or meetings – Up to date, TBS hosted 3 congresses of the Balkan Clinical Laboratory Federation (the latest was the 15th Congress of BCLF organized under the Auspices of IFCC, in Antalya between September 3-7, 2007), 3 meetings of Balkan Biochemical Biophysical Days as well as a meeting of the Balkan Association of Biosciences, each with 800-1 000 participants. The Society also hosted the 31st FEBS Congress in Istanbul between 24-29 June, 2006, receiving 2500 participants from 67 countries. At this Congress, 394 young scientists were supported by TBS, only 18 of them were Turkish citizen.

The last but not least, TBS Izmir Branch organized the first IVD Symposium and brought together laboratory professionals, the IVD sector and the legal authorities (Fig. 3).

- Undergradute and postgraduate educational meetings In cooperation with IUBMB Educational Committe, TBS organized 5 "Biochemistry and Molecular Biology Education" meetings of which 2 were in Ankara (1987, 1998) and the rest in İzmir (1992, 2000, 2012). Recently, 8th FEBS Workshop on Biochemistry and Molecular Biology Education: "Trends in Undergradute Biomolecular Science Education and Tips for Postgraduate Students and Beyond" was organized in Izmir (March, 2012) followed by "New Perspectives in Molecular Life Sciences Education" which was organized in Istanbul (November, 2012). Another major event in the area of education is the workshop "Multidisciplinary Approach to Biochemistry Laboratory Education", organized on May, 2012 at Ankara.
- Publications Turkish Journal of Biochemistry (TJB) is published by TBS since 1976 on a quarterly basis and covers research and review articles on all aspects of biochemistry and related fields. The journal is indexed in Chemical Abstract since 1979, in addition to Index Copernicus and Directory of Open Access Journals (DOAJ), SCI Expanded, Journal Citation Reports/Science Edition (SCIE-2007), EMBASE, Scopus, Ulrich's Periodical Directory, EBSCO and Turkish Medical Index. TJB is open-access for TBS members and online since 2002 (http://www.turkjbiochem.com) and is published by the independent academic publisher De Gruyter since 2015.
- Supports for young biochemists TBS provides bursaries and awards particularly for strong encouragement of young graduate students and post-docs to present their work orally or as posters in meetings. On the occasion of the national congresses, TBS also gives prizes for the best poster or selected oral communication.

Recent achievements

TBS was honored to host the "IFCC WORLDLAB 2014", at the IFCC Conference in April 2008. The Congress Organising Commitee worked very hard to create a state of the art Congress both scientifically and socially (Fig.4). The Congress took place in Istanbul Convention Center (ICC), between the dates of June 22-26, 2014. This Congress differs from the preceeding IFCC Congresses because for the first time, in the history of IFCC, all the sister federations/societies were together; AACC, AFCB, AFCC, APFCB, BCLF, COLABIOCLI, EFLM and WASPaLM and each of them contributed to IFCC Worldlab/ Istanbul Congress with a symposium. We are happy to state that many colleagues from 116 different countries had joined us and we received more than 1600 abstracts.



The Scientific Program included:

- 1 outstanding Opening Lecture and 4 Plenary Lectures, from the world's most renowned scientists.
- 26 Symposia, 42 Oral Communications selected from the abstracts and 1614 poster were displayed.
- 8 Symposia by contributing sister Federations, 5 IFCC Sessions and 3 poster lunch sessions.
- 23 ISW and 3 Satellite Meetingss (XIII. ICPLM, PoCT, LC-MS/MS in Clinical Chemistry).
- An education workshop by the IFCC-FEBS-ORPHEUS education committies on "PhD training in Clinical Chemistry, Clinical Biochemistry, and Laboratory Medicine: Where are we heading ?"

Recently, TBS was also honored to host 41st FEBS Congress that will take place between September 3-8, 2016 at the Ephesus Convention Center in Kusadasi, Turkey.
